UNM Hospitals—New Mexico Burn Center

The mission of the UNMH Trauma, Surgical, and Burn Intensive Care Unit — a component of the New Mexico Regional Trauma Center residing in the only Level One Trauma Center in the State of New Mexico — is to provide the best-possible burn and trauma care to the injured adult patient. This unit has a collaborative practice model among the nursing and physician teams, that work together to ensure quality in the care of critically ill Trauma, Surgical and Burn patients. The 24-bed unit includes a six-bed burn center with state-of-the-art hydrotherapy equipment. Nurse staffing ratios are dependent on the acuity and needs of the patient. Physician coverage includes a 24-hour, in-house unit resident. This unit has assigned ancillary personnel including Physical Therapists, Social Workers, Case Managers, Respiratory Therapists, and Pharmacists who assist in the care of inpatients, and help to plan care for patients upon discharge.

Pediatric patients are cared for in the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU), which offers high-level technology interwoven with Family-Centered Care. As part of the only Level I Trauma Center in the state, collaboration and communication among all team members within the PICU — along with the Burn and Trauma team — are essential aspects to assure quality care.
